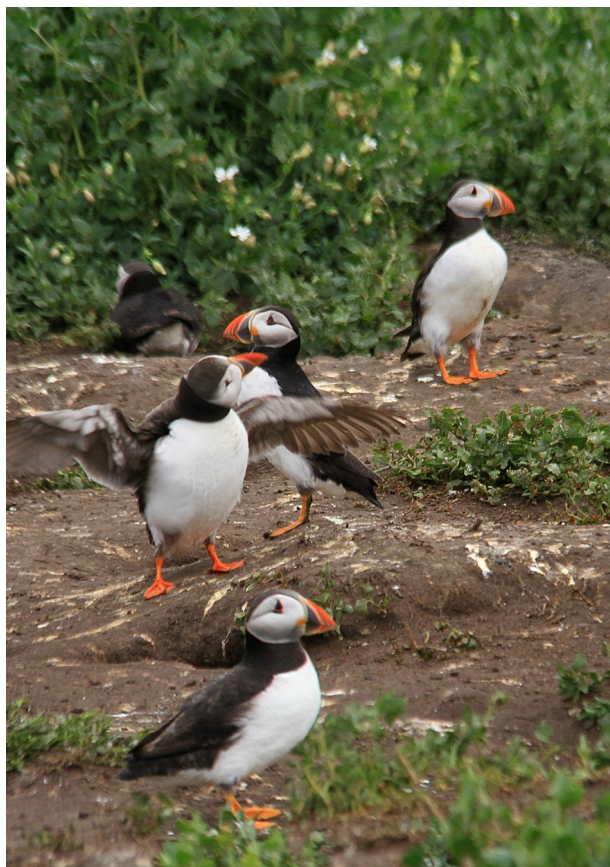

Practising The Art of Slowing Down

So often we are aware that there's relevant wisdom for our life in the bible, but from what we hear and understand of it at first pass, it simply asks too much of us to be of any practical help in today's world. I think the problem is we rush it, our attention is pulled away and we're distracted - to taste and see that the Lord is good we've got to go gently. We struggle to find the time to sit with God's truth, to pray into it for meaning, and allow it to speak to our specific needs. In a world of fast communication we need to practise deeper consideration - put simply, we've got to slow down!

Taking a look at 'The Sermon on the Mount', we realise quite quickly that these empirical teachings need a divine coaching beyond the classroom in order to take root in our life. Jesus placed the highest value on not just loving your neighbour, but loving your enemy too. He emphasised that the whole spiritual journey with God is about becoming the kind of person who is pervaded by love, simply because God is love. This profound change of heart takes time, we know that love is the goal but the perpetual business of life is our persistent enemy. One of the problems of this day and age is that we're rushing around, just too busy to stop and spend enough time to invest in ourselves in this way. Yet it's only going to be through stopping to receive God's love that we're going to be able to open ourselves up to an appropriate depth of genuine love for the people we encounter.

God wants us to notice with him what is important in life. As modelled by Jesus who was rarely in a hurry, love has a gentle inner speed. We need to take note of this gentle spiritual speed that often showed Jesus as sleeping or resting even though his life was so full. Wherever Jesus was present, he was fully in tune with everything that was going on around him - he was always fully engaged with both God the Father and that particular person who had crossed his path. So many of Jesus' encounters with people happened through interruptions. In the midst of our time hungry days we'd probably struggle with that, I certainly do, and yet we see Jesus welcome each one of them. Being very present he always responds with compassion, wisdom and of course a prophetic clarity.

This love he models and shares for us is a love that overflows from the heart.

This love and this experience can only come from us being in community, an engagement that stretches from family and friends and on out into our church and wider. This is lumpy and bumpy and uncomfortable and of course it takes time. Through purposefully taking our time, we are more likely to notice the opportunities and blessings that God has in store for us in order to enrich our lives. We work with him as he shapes us into the fullness of who we were originally created to be. As we go gently and slow down, we'll appreciate our time with him as enriching - our imperfections are slowly washed away and our renewed God given character will increasingly shine through.

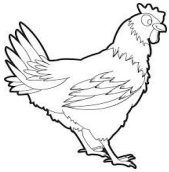

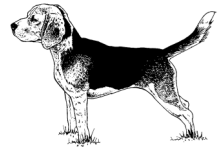

Pound Cake

Pound cake first appeared in the early 1700s (18th century) when the Wesley family was growing up. We don't know whether they ever ate any but it grew in popularity throughout the 18th century. It appeared in a recipe book in 1747.

It was called pound cake because it was traditionally made with a pound (450g) each of flour, butter, eggs and sugar.



Its texture is traditionally dense but has lovely rich buttery taste.

So here is the recipe. Get an adult to help you make a cake that has been around for nearly 300 years! Yummy!

The Recipe

It should take about 20 minutes to prepare although it took me longer! 50 minutes cooking time.

At least 30 minutes while you eagerly wait for it to cool! Then make a drink for yourself and enjoy a slice of it still slightly warm!

Ingredients

- Milk: 45ml or 3 tablespoons
- Eggs: 3 large at room temperature (or 5 medium)
- Flour: 450g. You can use ordinary self-raising flour but I used McDougalls Supreme Sponge extra fine self-raising flour (available at Morrisons and other supermarkets) which is specially for cakes.
- Vanilla extract: 6g or one teaspoon (this was not around when Wesley was alive!)
- Caster Sugar: 420g
- Baking powder: 4g 3/4 of a teaspoon
- Salt: 1/4 teaspoon
- Butter: 185 grams, unsalted, softened. But just soft not greasy and sloppy. You can also use margarine.

Instructions:

1. **Preheat** the oven to 180 degrees or 165 for a fan oven. Arrange a shelf so that the loaf tin can sit in the middle of the oven.
2. **Prepare** the tin. Ensure the cake won't stick. Line with greaseproof paper stuck on with butter, or grease the tin and dust with flour knocking out any excess.
3. Whisk **the wet ingredients**: In a medium bowl, lightly whisk together the milk, eggs and vanilla. Set aside.
4. **Whisk the dry ingredients**: Place the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt into a large bowl or stand mixer. Beat together for a few seconds using an electric beater or stand mixer until completely mixed.
5. **Add eggs**: Add butter, and the egg mixture. Beat slowly at first and increase to top speed and beat for about a minute and a half until you have thick batter.
6. Fill tin: Scrape batter into the prepared loaf tin and bake for 50-55 minutes.
7. **To ensure the cake is ready stick a skewer or a knife into the cake.** If it comes out clean then it is ready.
8. Cool: Cool in the tin for at least ten minutes then turn it out on the wire rack to cool completely.
9. ENJOY!

Random Thoughts

Village churches have long been a fascination and a magnet for exploration and so it was that at the southern feet of Dartmoor I came upon a jewel among granite cottages, surrounded by its acre of sunken and lichened memorials and watched over by an ancient yew. Perhaps the yew was as old as the church for it was the shell of a hollow giant, drawing sustenance only from its living ramparts.

I stepped inside to feel for a few moments the embrace of centuries and the pulse of the living earth.

And then a fresh delight was to find the church had escaped the violence of the seventeenth century for the medieval paintings on pulpit and screen were intact.

But I was not alone in the silence, for a man was sitting in a pew. Perhaps my entrance had disturbed his solitude? 'No, he assured me, and we exchanged pleasantries. And then he said, "I try to find God, but I can't seem to..." I knew what he meant, and recalled my youth when a multitude of differing religious voices all declared themselves to be The Way. And I remembered an old Methodist, a saintly man, to whom I confessed my spiritual confusion.

"My faith," he said gently "is as free as the flowers in the field, and as enduring as the stars in the sky. I keep my eyes on Jesus."

And perhaps it's that simple really, and surmounts the power struggles, the agonies, the doubts and the failings of history. If we keep our eyes on Jesus can we be far wrong? For his message was of the simplest: love and forgiveness. We all need love because love puts a value on each one of us and we need to love because that fulfils and expands our being. We need forgiveness because not one of us gets it all right all the time, and we need to forgive because that purges us of rancour, resentment, our grudges and reflex for revenge which poison the purity of our hearts.

Job done.

I shared these simple thoughts with my friend the stranger and left him sitting in God's house among the questions of the sleeping centuries. He may be still looking for God, but I'm sure God found him a long time ago.

Sometimes customers ask how we like to be paid. They are aware, they tell us, that we pay commission whenever they use a credit or debit card, so would we prefer cash. Payment by cheque seems to have fallen out of fashion. We have hardly any people offering to pay that way now, although we will still take them.

We do pay commission on each card transaction, but the main cost of taking cards is the standing charges, the cost of each transaction is usually only pence. And when we pay cash into the bank, we also have to pay commission, which is only slightly lower than that paid on the cards. So, it really makes no difference, cash is very slightly cheaper for us to process, but we have to go to Exeter or Taunton to pay it in. With cards, we are refunded the money usually the following day, which helps with our cash flow.

And what about credit? At present one group of churches has a credit arrangement with us. When someone is buying something on behalf of the church, they just tell us and take the goods. We then email an invoice to the church's treasurer, often with a discount, who then pays us by transferring the money directly into our bank account.

This saves the person buying the goods having to get a receipt from the shop, then passing it to the treasurer who then reimburses them. Do you think this would be of benefit to your church? Just contact me and we can simply set it up.

Of course, he helped in many other ways, including being on the rota to run the shop and café on a Saturday morning with his wife, Kathy.

I would wish them a long and peaceful retirement, but I know the Lord still has plenty of work for them to do. Instead, we, the staff, customers and trustees can only give Bruce and Kathy our thanks for their service to our Lord with us, and pray that He will bless them and all they do in the future.
